Psalms 1 – God’s Word

Verse 2 is the key to this short but truthful Chapter.

Remember any where the Bible uses the term Law, it is God’s Word.

What we call the Bible today.

So what we have here is sound advice. Don’t listen to those who do not know the Lord. Look to the Word of God to answer the tough questions that come your way. This is not talking about technical skills or business advice. It is talking about taking our problems to God or a Godly man or women. Jesus is the author of all truth. If you want a true answer, you need to tap into him. It’s always best to start with reading his Word. Pastors and Christian counselors are good sources too. Verse 3 mentions the fruit. This is the same as the fruit Paul told us about in Galatians, the Fruits of the Spirit.

We should have this good fruit.

I think we all want to be more patient and loving along with being gentle. These are good fruit to have. And they are developed by reading God’s word and living it.

Day 4

Psalms 5 – Call on God

Verse 1 & 2

Here we see a cry from David for God to listen. Don't we all feel like that at times? We need to hear from God in a major way, and really need him to hear our request.

This Psalms along with several others are cries from David, showing us it's OK to call on the Lord in Desperation.

I can't find any where in the Bible where it says to be on your best behavior and only come to God in a suit and tie quietly.

He does say come humbly, but boldly. He also says come calling over and over again as Jesus explained in the parable of the neighbor needing bread. Come calling, wake him up and keep calling until you get an answer.

So feel free to call on God in desperation, and keep calling.

Verse 3 is an important next step. Call yes. Now listen. David waited expectantly.

Don't call if you aren't ready to listen. You'll just miss the answer, and be right back where you started.

Yes, when calling to God, you can and should do it out loud. You can't call out in your mind. That would be "Thinking Out."

Verse 4 through 8

Remember this is written by a man who did not live a sinless life. He doesn't claim to live a sinless life. He even had a man killed so he could steal his wife. So how can he call for God to destroy others? We know today that God forgives all sin, if we repent.

Repentance; the key to repentance is humbleness, admitting we have done wrong. This means we are admitting our need for Jesus.
